







There are 23 questions worded such that Agreement is the likely benchmark desired result. Scatter plot shows distribution of the average (mean) scores for these 23 questions.


There were 176 responses in total, although not everyone answered all questions or answered regarding demographics. There were 5,030 students enrolled (excludes OU students) for a 3.5% response rate. Charts below show results for specific questions, in (somewhat arbitrary) clusters based on degree of agreement with the questions.

















Question with largest and smallest standard deviation in answers.


Largest:




Mean score White: 3.25

Mean score Minority: 3.22








Mean score male: 1.98
