Upon graduating from Rose State, any student receiving an Associate of Science in Health and Sports Science with a Health, Physical Education and Recreation option will be successfully prepared to transfer to Southwestern Oklahoma State University (SWOSU) institution to pursue a major of Health and Physical Education within the department of Kinesiology.

Students graduating with an Associate of Science degree from Rose State College will have completed the general education requirements for a bachelor's degree at Southwestern Oklahoma State University.

At a minimum, the following completed courses will be applied in whole to the pursuit of the above bachelor's degree major requirements.

Students pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education are required to complete the following courses:

Students must also complete 40 hours of professional education requirements, meet the foreign language proficiency, and meet the requirements of the Department of Education with regard to K-12 teacher certification.

Other regulations pertaining to graduation with a Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education include:

- 120 minimum credit hours
- 55 minimum credit hours in the liberal arts & sciences
- 40 minimum credit hours in upper-division (3000/4000) level courses including 8 in major completed at SWOSU
- 30 minimum credit hours at SWOSU (at least 15 of last 30)
- All courses classified as professional teacher education must be acquired from a four-year accredited program

Additional substitutions may be made at the department level (HPER 2333 SPORTS NUTRITION for SPRTM 4163 SPORTS NUTRITION; HPER 2333 APPLIED ANATOMY for KINES 3443 KINESIOLOGY & ANATOMY; ETC.) to satisfy the degree requirements if the 40 minimum credit hours in upper-division (3000/4000) level courses is maintained.
