# ROSE STATE COLLEGE – RETIREE SPOTLIGHT

When they asked me to write something for the Newsletter, my initial unspoken response was "Wouldn't it be better to hear from some of the 'old guys and ladies' first." Then it dawned on me that they did ask one of the really "old" guys, one retired for more than twenty years. Seems a rather short time since I was the youngest faculty member at Howard College in Big Spring, Texas, or a 27 year old Assistant Professor at "Central State College" or a 30 year old Division Chair at "Oscar Rose Junior College". Their question to me: "What made you want to be a cattle farmer during your retirement?" My answer: First I should note that it could happen only because Jean and I have long shared the lure of 'country living'. To live on a ranch or farm and be able every day to raise cattle and enjoy the beauty and serenity of nature and wildlife has always been something of a never-expected-to-fulfill dream. Guess I'm something of a "tree-hugger" conservationist!!! Living things fascinate me, whether it be a newborn calf or a wild turkey, or a rattlesnake in its natural setting or freshly-sprouted wheat that was planted a mere three days before.

I grew up in a Western Oklahoma farm family of eight boys and three girls. We lived modestly and worked hard and played hard. We boys had the freedom and open space to do whatever we wanted and were 'big' enough to do as long as the chores and any assigned work was done first. Our play included fighting as brothers will do, hunting and fishing (sometimes with Dad and sometimes alone but nearly always unsupervised), horseback riding (sometimes roping a calf

we were not supposed to) and generally enjoying God's natural creations. Work included milking cows twice a day and caring for all the farm animals which included everything from chickens to horses and cattle---as well as wild pets we had at the time and that could have been a crow, rabbit, turtle or skunk. I enjoyed the cattle which consisted primarily of cows and calves and at least one bull. Too many kids for us to have any livestock of our own! I always wanted a mother cow of my own so perhaps that early desire is why Jean and I enjoy a small herd of cattle now, usually thirty-five to forty mother cows and their calves.

If all this sounds idyllic that's because that is how I recall it, and that is how we see life today. Of course we sorely miss all our friends and activities from the College. Now our life tends to center on our children and their families which include 8 grandkids and 8 great grandkids----all of whom enjoy coming to the farm to enjoy Granee's cooking, watching spring-born baby calves play, perhaps seeing deer or wild turkey and even catching a fish with Grandad.
